

Pastor Musings

Thoughts and Advice from Pastor Joe, St. Mark UMC, February 2025 What are the United Methodist Church's Social Principles?

"He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?"—Micah 6:8, NRSV

You've probably heard about Episcopalian Bishop Mariann Budde. In her sermon at the Inaugural prayer service, she called on the president to show mercy to immigrant and LGBTQ+ communities. Lots of people have lots of opinions about it, and I encourage you to read or watch the sermon itself before giving heed to such opinions. But it is a good opportunity to remind ourselves that as followers of Jesus Christ, while Christ's church is not partisan, our walk with Jesus inevitably impacts our engagement with communal and public issues.

But where can Jesus followers find resources to faithfully engage in public issues? Fortunately, the United Methodist Church has the Social Principles, a 35-page reflection on how our faith in Christ intersects with the environment, economy, family, justice, government, human rights, and a variety of social issues. These reflections and positions are rooted in the Bible.¹

I find the Social Principles to be affirming and challenging, with positions that do not neatly align with one political party. Some of the positions lean "liberal" (environment, poverty, racism, immigration, LBGTQ inclusion, health care), while other positions lean

"conservative" (monogamy, alcohol use, assisted suicide, pornography, gambling), and other positions that don't easily map onto our normal political binary. As you're able, I encourage you to start reading the Social Principles: https://www.umcjustice.org/documents/124. The Social Principles are not binding doctrine; United Methodists are allowed to disagree with statements in them. But they are a helpful resource to push away the noise of "talking head" opinions, and to begin reflecting on how Jesus calls us to love God and neighbor in the public arena.

Happy New Year from the teachers and children at St. Mark UMC Preschool! We hope you're staying cozy and warm in this chilly weather.



History of St. Mark Continued...

The M.Y.F. and Youth Choir are very active participants in the church life. In 1979, they prepared the musical drama, "Make It Clear" and took it on tour to churches in other towns, including San Antonio and Austin. In 1980 their production was, "Bright New Wings", which was given quite professionally. They were on tour with it five days after giving it twice at St. Mark, and ending their tour in Houston where they spent an extra day at Astro World. All during the year they had held fund-raising events to finance the trip.

St. Mark membership now tops 1,000. The sermon each Sunday is aired the following Sunday on delayed broadcast over KRIO. Tapes of the sermons are also available for shut-ins, and some of our Winter Texans subscribe for them during the summer. The tape service is supported by the pennies dropped into the collection plate, and was established in memory of Mrs. Adelaide Marshall.

St. Mark has sponsored five young people to become ministers. Mr. & Mrs. Jack Nester left in 1974 when Jack entered Perkins Theological Seminary in Dallas. Joyce Slade was sponsored in 1977. Rick

Mang was sponsored in 1978. Jon Edward (Jet) Throckmorton has 2 degrees and plans to start Seminary school in the Fall of 1980. Robert DeLair is in Pre-ministerial training. We are very proud of these young people.
