

Meet the St. Mark UMC Preschool Teacher


Hello! My name is Ms. Irene I am the PreK-1 Classroom Teacher. I have three amazing kids in my classroom this new school year for 2025-2026.

Pastor Musings

Thoughts and Advice from Pastor Joe, St. Mark UMC, September 2025 Truth & Life, Sports & "Tribe"

"For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths." –2 Timothy 4:3-4, NRSV

Justin Giboney¹ has jokingly promoted what he calls the "tribal theorem of sports." Giboney sees sports as an outlet for our most basic us-vs.-them instincts. For example, my 49ers are winning the Super Bowl this year! Never mind that they offloaded much of their best talent, and their players are significantly older than even two years ago. They're my team, so I'm right and the facts are wrong, they're winning the Super Bowl this year!

Giboney light-heartedly promotes this "theorem" to highlight a major problem in churches and the broader societies we live in. Too often, when it comes to current events and religion, we only want to listen to perspectives and voices that confirm "our side," whatever that "side" might be—political party, denomination, faction, etc. Christians will sometimes even cloak this attitude in the language of faith, that one must be "certain" they are on the "right" side, and thus, any information that doesn't help one's "side" must be discarded as false.

However, God's "ways are higher than your ways, and [God's] thoughts than your thoughts" (Isaiah 55:9). Jesus himself brought together apostles from varying "sides," such as a Roman-supported tax collector and an anti-Roman zealot (Matthew 10:3; Luke 6:15). Finally, the Apostle Paul reminds us that on this side of eternity, "we see in a mirror dimly" (1 Cor.

13:12). So go ahead, root for your sports team irrationally! You might even think the Cowboys will win the Super Bowl this year if you're a Cowboys fan! But in all other areas of life, don't try to satisfy your "itching ears," but instead seek what is true, regardless of how convenient it is for your "side."

St. Mark UMC Pumpkin Patch

It is that time of year to start planning and getting ready for the St. Mark UMC yearly Pumpkin Patch! This is a HUGE fundraiser for our church and we need lots of volunteers to make it a successful one. Our pumpkins will be arriving on Saturday, September 27th, at 9am. Before they arrive we have some work to do to get everything ready for the pumpkins. We will need to start setting up the front yard of the church by placing the fence and pallets (mid Sept.). We need to decorate the patch for some great photo areas for the community to take their yearly pictures. This is also the time our bakers to begin baking some delicious pumpkin bake goods for the patch. And of course, lots of prayers for a blessed season and getting to reach out to those in our community.

This year our Pumpkin Patch will be open to the community from September 28th to October 31st. We will need volunteers to cover two hour shift times to help in the patch on evenings during the week (2pm to 7pm) and weekends (1pm to 8pm). In the next few weeks (and all of October), you can find the Pumpkin Patch signup binder in the Narthex. Being a volunteer is a great way of meeting people from our community and hearing their stories about our patch and for church members to get to know each other while working together in the patch. Now for a little about our pumpkins. It is a partnership of trust! Pumpkin Patch Fundraisers began their journey in 1974 with 3 acres of pumpkins and a partnership with one church. They now have over 1,000 non-profit organizations covering the Continental US, representing 25 denominations of churches and youth groups, schools, Scouts, and other non-profit organizations. Pumpkin Patch Fundraisers are responsible for all of the costs associated with growing, harvesting, and shipping. It is

the organizations trust to open their patch and sell as many pumpkins as they can, report their sales, and send them their percentage of sales. Pumpkin Patch Fundraisers makes it easy to volunteer in the patch by suppling a measuring tape to measure out the price for the pumpkins. The pumpkins are grown in Farmington, NM on the Navajo Indian Reservation. They now grow 35 varieties of pumpkins on 1,200 acres of land and over 700 Native Americans employed.
