Thoughts and Advice from Pastor Joe, St. Mark UMC, February 2024 Courageous Congregations Collaborative: Discerning Well, Together

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect." —Romans 12:2, NRSV

As you know, with our Pledge Drive, the return of Communion Rail Offerings, Affair of the Heart, and our upcoming Capital Campaign, we will be focusing a lot this year on **what we need** and **how we will get** the resources to continue our ministries. But whenever we seek money and resources for our ministries, we should always be asking the question: **why are we doing this? Why do we exist as a church, and why do we do what we do?** Fortunately, the United Methodist connection is here to help us with that discernment—and to discern so much more!

A small group from St. Mark UMC—*me, Jessica Flores, Romeo Robles, Lisa Gonzalez, Ed Keebaugh, & Moises Liñan*—are participating in a Texas Methodist Foundation cohort called Courageous Congregations Collaborative. We meet twice per month via Zoom, and plan on meeting at a retreat in May, with small groups from First UMC-Corpus Christi & First UMC-Sulphur Springs. Unlike many such programs, *this cohort does not promise numeric growth, nor does it mandate programming changes*. Rather, this cohort helps us practice "Five Adaptive Muscles" of vital congregations: *Grieving Well, Discerning Purpose, Walking Alongside, Distributing Power, & Expanding Imagination.* We don't know what the result of this four-month process will be. However, this gives us an opportunity to step back, even in the midst of busy ministries and related stresses, and ask

God where God has led us so far, and where God would have us go. Please pray for this group and offer us feedback and insight as you're able.
