Pastor Musings

From Pastor Joe, St. Mark UMC, March 2024 Seasons of Change in the United Methodist Church

"The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the Lord blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever."

—Isaiah 40:7-8, NRSV

As I wrote in December, the United Methodist Church is poised to experience a lot of change this year and the next few years. We hope and pray that the UMC would remain faithful to the Way of Jesus in, through, and beyond these changes, which could look like the following:

<u>United Methodist Church (world):</u> Our governing structure and our Social Principles are likely to be changed dramatically to recognize the global nature of the United Methodist. The term "regionalization" has been, and will be, used to describe these changes. *Core teachings of the UMC will remain the same, which centers faithfulness to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit as revealed in the written Word of God.* It is possible that prohibitions against gay weddings and partnered LGBTQ+ clergy will be removed, though that might not happen in 2024.

Rio Texas AC & El Valle District: It is likely that our bishop will continue to preside over Rio Texas and all of New Mexico, though what relationship the two conferences will have (Merger? Shared episcopal area?) remains to be seen. Additionally, it is likely that the geography of our district will expand to include most of South Texas, but the particular details are unknown.

<u>St. Mark UMC:</u> We will need to be more conscientious and proactive in retaining and strengthening relationships with other UMC congregations during this time of transition. But even as we adapt to these changes, our mission remains the same: to engage in ministry with our neighbors with inclusion, respect, hospitality, love, and grace for all people, consistent with the spirit of Jesus Christ.

History of St. Mark

From September 1951 to June, 1955 we continued to hold Sunday morning worship services in the Women's Building, with Sunday School classes and committee meetings held in various homes. Other denominations were most gracious in lending their facilities for large gatherings.

The parsonage became crowded and so the congregation decided to sell the Fourth Street parsonage and buy a new, brick, 3 bedroom home on the corner of Redwood and Fifth Street. The Zirkels held an open house on August 14, 1952.

On December 12, 1951, the Quarterly Conference authorized the purchase of a site located just west of the Women's Building bounded on the north and south by Pecan and Orange Streets and on the west by Fourth Street. The cost was \$10,000.00 of which First Church gave us \$5,000.00 and our congregation raised the rest.

During 1953 Rev. Zirkel had a 15 minute daily radio program over KRIO, entitled "Listen to Reason". It was very popular but eventually had to be discontinued because he received so many calls stemming from his program that he felt

he was neglecting his church duties. The Zirkels had a third son born during their pastorate at St. Mark.
